Despite a difficult year in the financial markets, we had a remarkable year of giving by donors and grants awarded in our communities.

A few highlights from the last year:

- Partnership with Midland Education Foundation to fund the Micro Grants program, awarding teachers grants for student learning enhancements.

grants scholarships

In 2022, Permian Basin Area Foundation and its donors awarded nonprofit organizations \$19.1 million in grants. Of that, the Foundation awarded \$4 million through semi-annual community grant requests for nonprofits in the Permian Basin and Trans-Pecos regions.

Through the community grant requests, the Foundation is able to award nonprofits through our undesignated and field of interest funds. A committee comprised of community volunteers review applications and financial information from 25-40 organizations each cycle. The committee recommendations are presented to the Board of Governors for final approval.

All other grants are awarded through donor recommendations, allocations from designated funds and agency endowments.

This was a milestone year for scholarships at Permian Basin Area Foundation. In 2022 Permian Basin Area Foundation awarded more than \$1,000,000 in scholarships to 405 area students.
